TYPES OF PROFESSIONAL AND PUBLIC SERVICE

This list provides examples of professional and public service activities that may be included in this section of a promotion dossier. It is not all-inclusive of activities that fulfill this requirement. Contributions from professional, public service, or both will be considered when assessing this area of service.

DEFINITION

Professional service is oriented to the professional policy needs of society; public service activities are oriented to public and professional needs of society. Any activity that demonstrates contributions to these areas on behalf of the department, college and/or university or that directly contribute to the mission and vision of the department, college and/or university may be considered as evidence of professional and/or public service.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICE

- Professional organization membership, (please include description of contributions to the organization)
- Election or appointment to professional organization officer, committee and/or task force
- Recognition as a fellow status within a professional organization
- Service as a reviewer for a journal or on an editorial board
- Service on a local, regional, national board, committee or task force

PUBLIC SERVICE

- Involvement at a community free or underserved medical clinic
- Involvement in community outreach programs aimed at improving health education/science
- Participation in humanitarian trips
- Presenter in public forums
- Volunteer service in the community, region, state, nation, or internationally
- Participation in University, college, or student community service projects
- Service on a community board or committee
- Service in a leadership position within a community service organization
